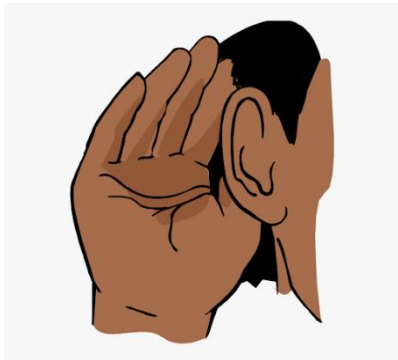
Children & Families – we thought you might like to see some photos of some of our church family – building a mini snowman!

Guide Dogs - As some of you will know I sponsored a Guide Dog for St Mark's 2 years ago, called "Joy". She is nearing the end of her training now. I have sponsored dogs for years and heard last week that "Eve" has passed with flying colours and is now loving helping her new blind owner. Miss Ava Bush was a part of our Church family for many years in the late 70's

early 80's and she had a lovely Guide Dog called "Odin". They always sat on the front row on the right in Church. Odin had his own carpet offcut to lie on (tiled floor in those days). He used to take Ava to the altar and stand with his front paws on the kneeler for Communion. He received a blessing and a dog biscuit. Ava told me a story one day. She had prepared the dogs dinner and put it on the floor in the kitchen then the phone rang. She answered it and spent about half an hour chatting. Afterwards she then put her hand down beside her chair where Odin always came to sit with her for the evening but he was not there!! Ava went back into the kitchen and nearly slipped on a very wet floor. She then realised she hadn't given him the "eat it" instruction so he had had 30 minutes looking at his dinner with saliva pouring from his mouth. Ava was distraught and burst into tears and told him to "eat it" but before he did he insisted on licking her profusely as she knelt beside him saying "sorry". It was Ava and Odin who inspired me to love this cause. Joy xx
