ANOTHER UPDATE ABOUT FUTURE SERVICES AT ST MARK'S

By now you're probably all aware that the decision has been made to delay the move to stage 4 of the Government Roadmap until July 19th.

Therefore, as we explained in last week's notices, we will continue for the time being with the current situation of limiting numbers in church, so please continue to book a place each Sunday with Maggie – this is not just for making sure that we are able to maintain social distancing, it also means that we have a record of attendance if we should require it for test and trace purposes (the record is only kept for 3 weeks).

The plan for the pattern of services for the next month will be as follows –

Sunday 27th June – 10am Communion service in church, livestreamed on Zoom and uploaded to Youtube. Plus outdoor Sunday School (more details to follow).

Sunday 4th July – 10am Communion service in church, as above, plus outdoor Sunday School.

Sunday 11th July – 10 am Communion service in church, as above, plus outdoor Sunday School.

Sunday 18th July – 10am All Age Service either on Zoom or outdoors; 11.15am Communion service in church; Service of the Word on Youtube.

We hope that once we move to stage 4 we will no longer need to limit numbers, and we can return to our pre-pandemic pattern of services, but this will of course be subject to Government and national Church guidelines.

Phase and The Hitchin Home Olympics

For many years, Phase has been doing a wonderful job of supporting young people in our local schools, helping them to learn about emotional and mental wellbeing and what they can do to look after it. As you can imagine, they have been very busy during

lockdown and since schools have returned to face to face learning. So after a difficult year, they thought it would be great to have some fun together and raise funds (target £10,000) to continue their brilliant work. To this end they are hosting the Hitchin Home Olympics and are inviting all churches to get involved.

There are two ways to do this:

The June Olympic Relay Torch Challenge – they aim to take a **virtual** torch all the way from Hitchin to Tokyo - 5,953 miles. Phase would love people to walk a mile (or more) and donate £1 towards their fundraising target.

The Olympics Challenge – this is going to take place from 2 – 16 July. Phase invite us to get involved and set ourselves a sponsored Olympic-themed challenge, whether sporty or otherwise (e.g. learning 20 words of Japanese, making sushi).
