**HITCHIN PANTRY – New!** Liz Wills from Our Lady's Church is helping to set up a new type



of food provision system to replace the Food parcels that have been delivered for the past 18 months by many volunteers. This new initiative will be a Pantry (Community shop) that people can visit on a Friday, 2-4pm and Saturday 1-3pm in the Scout Hall at Our Lady's and for a membership fee of £4 per week they will be able to select food (worth about £20) that they need (fresh and longer life) for them and/or their family.

## TO MAKE THIS WORK WE NEED HELP

Liz is breaking the jobs down so that the time needed from any individual may average out about 30-90 minutes per week depending on the job volunteered for.


The type of Volunteers needed are for

- Set Up Teams & Clear Up Teams before and after the sessions on a Friday and Saturday afternoon including food and health & safety checks
- Drivers to collect food from local supermarkets on Thursday and Friday evenings
- Drivers to collect food from Fareshare in Milton Keynes & Felix Project in Enfield on Thursday or Friday mornings.
  - All drivers will be compensated for their petrol costs or can use the FUWU (Feedup warm up vans) to collect the food. These jobs do involve lifting and loading things into the cars and vans and unloading back at the scout hall.
  - With enough driver volunteers you may only need to help once or twice a month.
- Admin staff to count items and check food dates and log fridge temperatures to maintain food hygiene records. They will also require people to help count and record the session takings.
- Sales Assistants to help when the Pantry is open to the public

This is being opened by Bishop Paul on 29th October so we really need volunteers as soon as possible to ensure we have things in place. Liz has a training session set up for Monday 18<sup>th</sup> 11-1pm so the sooner she can get her volunteers on board the better.
